Physician-assisted suicide is legal in 11 states, Washington, D.C., and a growing number of countries. Maryland has introduced "End of Life" legislation in the 2025 session, with strong support for its passage. This seminar will explore the legal and ethical history of the right to die, details of the proposed Maryland law, similar laws elsewhere, and professional perspectives from medical, social work, psychology, and counseling fields. The legislation outlines requirements for patients and protections for healthcare providers. Controversy arises as some countries have expanded laws to include euthanasia and mental illness as a qualifying condition. Judge Dana Moylan Wright and Dr. Burke will provide insights on these issues.

Participant Learning Objectives:

- Review Maryland (proposed) End of Life legislation and the requirements for those seeking physician assisted suicide
- Outline the roles of physicians, other medical providers and mental health professionals in the Maryland End of Life legislation
- Explain the distinction between physician assisted suicide and euthanasia
- List the states and countries which allow physician assisted suicide and euthanasia
- Examine the laws of those countries where mental illness is an allowable reason to seek physician assisted suicide
- Describe the arguments for and against physician assisted suicide
- Review the codes of ethics and positions of professional medical and mental health associations concerning physician assisted suicide
- Examine the concern that physician assisted suicide and euthanasia are "Slippery Slopes"
- Understand palliative care as an end of life option

J Emmet Burke, PhD, JD, Clinical Psychologist, Brook Lane. Dr. Burke holds a Doctorate in Clinical Psychology from The Catholic University of America in Washington, DC and Juris Doctorate from the University of Maryland School of Law.
